Interesting statistics on Radio TV news-room size. TV newsroom employment decreased last year about 15%, and 55% of all TV stations reported that their news staff size decreased and their budgets decreased. The average size of a TV news-room...31 full-time staffers. The range for average size is 54 staffers in the top 25 markets, down to 18 staffers for markets 150 and beyond. For radio the news remains the same as it has for a decade or more. The average staff size for radio station newsroom is...one person. In major markets the average size staff is 2 people
