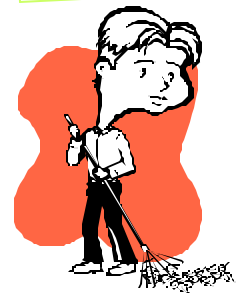
Incidentally, the October speaker will be **Roger LaMay**, General Manager of 88.5 WXPB.
